24th March 2024 - Palm Sunday

This Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week when we celebrate all that is central to our faith as Christians, the death and resurrection of our Lord, and the institution of the eucharist. The number of people attending church usually increases significantly and we are often joined by visitors from other parishes. I hope everyone will feel welcome. The Gospel readings recounting the Passion of our Lord are much longer than usual and I would advise everyone to remain seated for these. The time of the Easter Vigil is also slightly earlier this year coinciding with the time of sunset. It is also the weekend when we change the clocks, but I hope that will not deter anyone from attending the most unique celebration in the church calendar. Let us pray that all will go well for our parish and that we will experience God's blessing at this special time of the year.

The Good Friday Ecumenical Walk of Witness will begin at 10.00am from St Leonard's Hall on Racecourse Drive, moving down Innage Lane, calling at St John's Church, before moving on to the Town Hall for short service. Refreshments will then be served at the Baptist Church. Please consider joining in as much as you feel able to do.

We have a Barn Dance with Odd Socks Ceilidh Band in the parish hall on Saturday 13th April at 7.30pm. Tickets costing £5 are on sale now at the back of church. Children's admittance is free.
